ACT1 Theater is proud to celebrate its $\frac{25th}{26^{th}}$ season in $\frac{2020}{2021!}$

Born of the love of theater, ACT1 was lovingly guided for years by Founder Moira Thornett. The first of many theatrical productions at Alpharetta Presbyterian Church ("APC") was *The Best Christmas Pageant Ever* in 1995. ACT1 Theater was officially organized in 1997 and the first public production of the theater group was *The Littlest Angel*. Early productions were held in the old APC sanctuary using temporary curtains, with no sound or lighting. With the construction of the present APC sanctuary, ACT1 converted the old sanctuary in 1998 to a dedicated theater space, which hosts as many as four mainstage shows per year, and specialty events such as cabarets and dinner theater.

ACT1 Theater has gone from plays put on by church members for church members, to a recognized outreach in the Alpharetta area and vibrant member of the Metro Atlanta theater community. The quality of productions has grown over the years, resulting in several Metropolitan Atlanta Theater Awards since their inception in 2006.

In 2018, ACT1 Theater was approached by the City of Alpharetta as Alpharetta's only operating theater group to form a partnership with the City and the theater arts organization under the umbrella of Arts Alpharetta. As part of that partnership with the City, ACT1 Theater has produced cabarets in Brooke Street Park, Shakespeare productions in Wills Park, and performances in the Alpharetta Arts Center Black Box Theater. ACT1 is proud to contribute to Alpharetta's art scene and quality of life for its residents and visitors!

ACT1 planned a big year in 2020 to celebrate its 25th anniversary. Unfortunately, ACT1's 25th season, like nearly everything else in the world, was derailed by the pandemic. So we are celebrating our 25th anniversary a year late!

Dear Friend of ACT1 Theater:

Guess Who's Coming to Dinner opened for a single night on March 6, 2020 – then the theater went dark. When deciding what our first live mainstage show would be coming back from that dark time, we knew this fabulous cast needed a chance to shine again and, given the events of the last 18 months, the subject matter is more relevant than ever. We appreciate your presence here and hope we provide you with a brief respite and food for thought. Our cast and crew are hungry to perform their craft for live audiences, though we appreciate those that supported our efforts to entertain during the pandemic with on-demand performances of "*It's a Wonderful Life: A Live Radio Play*" in December, "*Gee's Bend*" in February, and live Shakespeare in the Park in October. Many thanks to the City of Alpharetta for letting us rehearse and film in the Alpharetta Arts Center, and to our casts and crews who endured safety protocols so we could bring you some small distraction. We are moving forward with hope, passion and a fabulous season!

We wish you health and happiness, and we hope to see you at our future productions! In closing, I will reiterate part of my address to the audience appearing in the 2020 program for *Guess Who's Coming to Dinner*. It sums up who we are and what we strive to be. And that is what the world needs more of right about now. Bless us all.

From March 2020: "ACT1 is black, white, brown, and yellow. We are gay and straight. We are male, female, and transgender. We are married, single, and divorced. We are both young and old and attract dozens of young adults. We involve more than 150 people to produce shows that attract nearly 3000 audience members. About 75% of both groups were from outside APC. But how did ACCEPTANCE in the community affect lives? Every year, ACT1 impacts individuals and 2019 was no different. Getting specific, ACCEPTANCE means that we helped multiple families in crisis, and those with wonderful life changes, to find fellowship and support in their demanding times. We saw several healthy love relationships develop for young adults in the program; extensions of the dozens of healthy, supportive friendships we've fostered among adults who were lonely. We worked with families to involve adults with mental health issues in our productions. We found opportunities to put senior performers on stage again. We helped people of all ages to gain confidence and self-esteem by giving them roles and new opportunities that challenged them. We reminded folks who have left the church that church is not like TV portrayals. For the community and for individuals, we embody ACCEPTANCE. And we remain an all-volunteer program. Our actors and crew don't pay to participate. Our Managing Director and Board members are volunteers. We fund all of our programs through ticket sales and the generous donation of theater space by Alpharetta Presbyterian Church, for which we are a community outreach. We'd love to have you be more involved! Our program includes people from all walks of life and levels of experience: This is the purpose and essence of community theater. We provide a place where people can be part of something bigger than themselves, learn new things, and make friends. There are lots of ways to get involved: Volunteer, volunteer, volunteer: We need everything from set builders to seamstresses to box office staff to marketers. You can be completely inexperienced or have limited time: We can find something big or small, onsite or remote that you can do to help. Contact me if you'd like to get involved with any aspect of ACT1 Theater. Appear on stage: Don't be shy and don't be discouraged. You'll never know when a director will think you're perfect for a role and here you can learn the craft and improve. Be in the audience: Talk about us. Tell your friends. Post on Facebook!"

The Tempest October 15-24, 2021 Fri/Sat at 8 pm – Wills Park







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
