#### **Hamlet Summary**

The play opens on the outside of Castle Elsinore in the state of Denmark. While the guards speak on the castle wall, the ghost of the former King appears to them, inspiring them to tell Prince Hamlet what they have seen. Inside the castle the former King's brother Claudius has married the Queen Gertrude and become King. Horatio, Hamlet's close friend comes to Hamlet and tells him of his father's ghost. Elsewhere in the castle, Laertes, son of Polonia and brother to Ophelia, cautions his sister against loving Hamlet, who has made propositions to her. Laertes returns to school in France.

On the castle wall, Hamlet speaks to his father's ghost. The ghost of the former King says that he was murdered by his brother Claudius who now where's his crown. Hamlet swears to put on an air of madness to trick his uncle into revealing what he has done.

Concerned by Hamlet's sudden madness, the king and Queen summon Hamlet's school friends, Rosencrantz and Guildenstern, to spy on their son. Polonia, the king's advisor, is convinced that the madness stems from Ophelia denying him her love. Hamlet confronts Ophelia when she tries to return his letters, and he demands she go to a nunnery and never marry. Rosencrantz and Guildenstern bring to the castle with them a troupe of actors. Hamlet asks the actors to perform a play wherein the King is poisoned by his brother who steals his crown. King Claudius is incensed and scared by this play, and Hamlet feels as though his uncle is trapped. Claudius confesses to the audience his crimes and Hamlet nearly kills him at prayers but stops himself. Gertrude summons her son to her chambers to find out the reason behind his madness. Hearing someone behind the tapestry, Hamlet stabs Polonia who was spying. The ghost appears again to Hamlet but Queen Gertrude cannot see him. Hamlet tells the Queen what the ghost has told him.

#### Intermission

Gertrude tells Claudius that Hamlet murdered Polonia and he sends the whole castle to find him and the body. Hamlet is sent away to England. Ophelia, in grief over her rejection by Hamlet and her mother's death appears to have also fallen into madness. After hearing of his mother's death, Laertes returns from France demanding satisfaction only to be met with his grief-broken sister. Sailors bring letters to Horatio and Claudius saying that Hamlet is on his way home from England. Claudius and Laertes plot to challenge Hamlet to a duel, during which Laertes will wound Hamlet with a poisoned sword. Claudius says that he will poison a cup to give to Hamlet if he wins the duel, ensuring Hamlet's death. Gertrude enters to tell Laertes that his sister Ophelia has died. Hamlet, now returned to Denmark, and Horatio sneak through a graveyard and happen upon a grave being dug and a funeral procession. Hamlet upon finding out that Ophelia has died, declares his love for her. Later that evening Hamlet is informed that Laertes is challenging him to a duel. Laertes and Hamlet duel, both ending up wounded with the poisoned sword. Gertrude drinks of the poisoned cup, and Laertes tells Hamlet of the King's plan. Hamlet stabs Claudius. The play ends with the death of Hamlet.




#### **Directors Note**



Does Hamlet go mad, or merely pretend to? Once he is sure that Claudius is a murderer, why does he not act? Was his mother, Gertrude, unfaithful to her husband or complicit in his murder?
