When I decided to pursue directing, I wanted to tell powerful stories. Pamela Parker's *A Higher Place in Heaven* definitely fits the bill. As a native Georgian who would make the trek to Waycross, Georgia to see her grandparents once or twice a year, I felt a distinct connection to *Higher Place's* South Georgia roots.

This is a story that deals with race relations and bigotry, but also grace and redemption. And it does so with a large amount of humor and heart. This was a story that I really wanted to tell.

I first directed a staged reading of *Higher Place* in February 2020, right before the pandemic shut things down. Pamela Parker's script came alive on that stage, and I will always remember that night as being magical. This was the first ever time I had directed anything, and that night showed that maybe, just maybe, I should keep doing this directing thing. That was the calm before the pandemic storm. Little did we know what was about to hit live theatre.

Fast forward two years later, and several pandemic-related hiccups, ACT11 Theater allowed me the opportunity to bring southern-fried magic to the stage again, this time as a full production. The cast has worked like crazy to bring this heartwarming and poignant story to life.

ACT1 Theater is proud to celebrate its 25th 26th season in 2020 2021-2022!

Born of the love of theater, ACT1 Theater was lovingly guided for years by Founder Moira Thornett. The first of many theatrical productions at Alpharetta Presbyterian Church ("APC") was *The Best Christmas Pageant Ever* in 1995. ACT1 Theater was officially organized in 1997 and the first public production of the theater group was *The Littlest Angel*. Early productions were held in the old APC sanctuary using temporary curtains, with no sound or lighting. With the construction of the present APC sanctuary, ACT1 converted the old sanctuary in 1998 to a dedicated theater space, which hosts as many as four mainstage shows per year, and specialty events such as cabarets and dinner theater.

ACT1 Theater has gone from plays put on by church members for church members, to a recognized outreach in the Alpharetta area and vibrant member of the Metro Atlanta theater community. The quality of productions has grown over the years, resulting in several Metropolitan Atlanta Theater Awards since their inception in 2006.

In 2018, ACT1 Theater was approached by the City of Alpharetta as Alpharetta's only operating theater group to form a partnership with the City and the theater arts organization under the umbrella of Arts Alpharetta. As part of that partnership with the City, ACT1 Theater has produced cabarets in Brooke Street Park, Shakespeare productions in Wills Park, and performances in the Alpharetta Arts Center Black Box Theater. ACT1 is proud to contribute to Alpharetta's art scene and quality of life for its residents and visitors!

ACT1 planned a big year in 2020 to celebrate its 25th anniversary. Unfortunately, ACT1's 25th season, like nearly everything else in the world, was derailed by the pandemic. So we are celebrating our 25th anniversary a year late!





Our Partnership with the City of Alpharetta

ACT1 Theater and the <u>City of Alpharetta</u> formed a partnership in 2017. Working together, we have produced plays and vignettes of William Shakespeare outdoors in <u>Wills Park</u>, a series of songs and scenes for the City's inaugural Summer Concert Series <u>in Brooks Street Park</u>, and plays in the <u>Alpharetta Arts Center</u> intimate Black Box Theater.

We are pleased to continue this partnership during ACT1 Theater's 2021-2022 season and the City of Alpharetta's 2022 Fiscal Year. As a result of this continuing partnership, we are offering these shows.

The King's young son Ferdinand, thought to be dead, falls in love with Prospero's daughter Miranda. Their celebrations are cut short when Prospero confronts his brother and reveals his identity as the usurped Duke of Milan. The families are reunited and all conflict is resolved. Prospero grants Ariel his freedom and prepares to leave the island.
