ACT1 Theater is proud to celebrate its 25th 26th season in 2020 2021!

Born of the love of theater, ACT1 was lovingly guided for years by Founder Moira Thornett. The first of many theatrical productions at Alpharetta Presbyterian Church ("APC") was *The Best Christmas Pageant Ever* in 1995. ACT1 Theater was officially organized in 1997 and the first public production of the theater group was *The Littlest Angel*. Early productions were held in the old APC sanctuary using temporary curtains, with no sound or lighting. With the construction of the present APC sanctuary, ACT1 converted the old sanctuary in 1998 to a dedicated theater space, which hosts as many as four mainstage shows per year, and specialty events such as cabarets and dinner theater.

ACT1 Theater has gone from plays put on by church members for church members, to a recognized outreach in the Alpharetta area and vibrant member of the Metro Atlanta theater community. The quality of productions has grown over the years, resulting in several Metropolitan Atlanta Theater Awards since their inception in 2006.

In 2018, ACT1 Theater was approached by the City of Alpharetta as Alpharetta's only operating theater group to form a partnership with the City and the theater arts organization under the umbrella of Arts Alpharetta. As part of that partnership with the City, ACT1 Theater has produced cabarets in Brooke Street Park, Shakespeare productions in Wills Park, and performances in the Alpharetta Arts Center Black Box Theater. ACT1 is proud to contribute to Alpharetta's art scene and quality of life for its residents and visitors!

ACT1 planned a big year in 2020 to celebrate its 25th anniversary. Unfortunately, ACT1's 25th season, like nearly everything else in the world, was derailed by the pandemic. So we are celebrating our 25th anniversary a year late!

Where you from, bruh?

OK, a quick hit (well, I thought it was going to be a short one when I started writing this) on pronunciation in *The Tempest*...

Prospero is the former Duke of Milan.

Where?

Well, many here in the states—for some reason—pronounce the word, with a long E sound in the first syllable, and an AH sound in the stressed second syllable: mee – LAHN. Which is how the folks over at emmasaying.com says it.

Of course, the folks over at PronounceNames.com play it two ways: the above for the Italian pronunciation (though for them the two syllables seem equally stressed), and two alternatives for English—the above and well as a softer first syllable: MI – LAHN (and again both syllables seem to be stressed).

Wikipedia, seems to have a more Italiano Italian pronunciation: mee – LAH – no.

So where does Shakespeare come out on all this?

None of the above.


First, for it to scan correctly, the emphasis has to be on the first syllable....

Tradition, and more importantly the research done by Ben Crystal for his authoritative study, *The Oxford Dictionary of Original Shakespearean Pronunciation*, has that first syllable a soft I sound, so that it's "MI – lun."

Thus, Prospero comes from Milan or "MI – lun."


Our Partnership with the City of Alpharetta

Their celebrations are cut short when Prospero confronts his brother and reveals his identity as the usurped Duke of Milan. The families are reunited and all conflict is resolved. Prospero grants Ariel his freedom and prepares to leave the island.
